WHAT WAS YOUR BIGGEST SHOW OF THE PAST YEAR?

The gallery has a long history representing Japanese artists, most notably Takashi Murakami and Yoshitomo Nara, and our most recent "Ragdoll for the Sea: The Art of Hiroko Ina," curated by Mika Yoshizaki. This show focused on Murakami's playful Japanese characters that had previously never been shown in any significant way to the United States. We chose who would be the show's curatorial group of artists as its view of the Pacific calls Dogeza during the Venice Biennale.

HOW HAS THE GALLERY CHANGED SINCE ITS FOUNDED?

Blum & Poe has grown significantly since opening in 1988. Our current location in Culver City offers an exciting footprint, which allows us to represent a much broader diversity of contemporary artists. We are proud to be an integral part of the local art scene, and we continue to grow and add new talent.

WHAT ARE YOUR PLANS FOR THE NEXT FIVE YEARS?

Over the next five years, Blum & Poe will focus on the gallery as the premier of opening to the wider art and exhibition space in Tokyo, which will focus on the needs of those artists living in Asia. It will also offer an opportunity for the Japanese and European artists we represent to have an outlet that work in Japan, something many have not had the chance to do before.

WHAT'S YOUR FAVORITE PLACE TO EAT NEAR THE GALLERY?

We are fortunate to have the delicious Japanese take-out of our 23-year history, but Sushi and Wagy Diner are some of the best choices and we're looking for more options.

WHAT EMERGING ARTIST ARE YOU MOST EXCITED ABOUT?

Hugh Scott-Douglas is one of the most exciting artists in the gallery. His work is a combination of photography and sculpture.
